Education - Homeless Children

This enrolled bill establishes a 14-member Task Force on the Education of Homeless Children and Youth in Maryland. The task force will review current policies, procedures, and practices for the education of homeless children and youth in the State. The State Board of Education is required to provide staff support. The task force must report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and General Assembly by June 1, 1998.

This bill takes effect June 1, 1997.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. Staff support could be provided with existing resources at no additional cost.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None. Small businesses would not be directly affected.

Fiscal Analysis

Additional Comments: As shown in **Exhibit 1**, there were 2,937 school-age homeless children in Maryland during the 1994-95 school year, of which 86% (2,530) attended school.
