House Bill 797 (Delegates Kach and Klima) Judiciary Referred to Economic and Environmental Affairs

Education - Portable Pagers on School Property

This enrolled bill repeals the requirement that local school officials report individuals who violate the prohibition against possessing portable pagers on school property to a law enforcement officer on the first offense. The bill still requires school officials to report individuals to a law enforcement officer on a second or subsequent offense.

This bill takes effect July 1, 1997.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: None. A smaller number of violations being reported to law enforcement agencies is not expected to directly affect local school or public safety expenditures.

Small Business Effect: None. Small businesses are not directly affected.
