Senate Bill 68 (Senator Boozer) Finance

### **Insurance - Agents or Brokers - Termination of Agency Agreement**

This bill prohibits insurers from terminating or refusing to renew written agreements with insurance agents or brokers about insurance unless the insurer complies with specified current law requirements. Under current law, insurers are only prohibited from canceling such agreements unless the insurer complies with the requirements. This bill does not apply to policies of life, health, surety, wet marine and transportation, or title insurance.

# **Fiscal Analysis**
