14 (a) At reasonable times and on reasonable notice, the administrator may

16 failed to report property that should have been reported under this title. THE

17 ADMINISTRATOR MAY NOT EXAMINE THE RECORDS OF ANY PERSON REGARDING

18 ABANDONED PROPERTY AFTER 5 YEARS FROM THE DATE THE PERSON FILED THE

19 REPORT WITH THE ADMINISTRATOR COVERING THE PERIOD OF TIME DURING WHICH

20 THE PROPERTY ALLEGEDLY BECAME ABANDONED, UNLESS THE ADMINISTRATOR

21 FINDS THAT THE PERSON ACTED FRAUDULENTLY OR WITH GROSS NEGLIGENCE

22 WITH RESPECT TO THE REPORT.

24 (a) Any person who fails to pay or deliver abandoned property to the 25 administrator as required by this title shall pay a penalty equal to [25] 15 percent of

26 the value of the property. If any person fails to file any report or refuses to deliver

27 property to the administrator as required by this title, the administrator may bring

28 an action in a court of appropriate jurisdiction to require the filing of the report and

29 to enforce delivery of the property.

30 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 31 June 1, 1998.
