- 3 FOR the purpose of permitting the Anne Arundel County Board of Education to fund
- 4 capital projects over a certain period of time, whether or not part of the period

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 1 **Article - Education** 2 5-305. 3 (a) Each county board shall keep: 4 All money for the construction of public school buildings and public 5 school facilities and the purchase of land for public schools in a separate account from 6 that used for current expenses; and A separate and independent accounting system for all public school 7 (2) 8 construction money. 9 (b) (1) In Anne Arundel County, the County Board may borrow from one 10 fund to meet temporary cash requirements of another fund or to reimburse another 11 fund for services performed. 12 (2) This borrowing or reimbursement is subject to the county charter. 13 5-305.1. 14 NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW, THE ANNE ARUNDEL 15 COUNTY BOARD MAY INCLUDE CAPITAL PROJECTS THAT ARE TO BE FUNDED OVER A 16 PERIOD OF 2 FISCAL YEARS IN THE CAPITAL BUDGET, WHETHER OR NOT PART OF 17 THE FUNDING PERIOD FALLS IN A CALENDAR YEAR THAT IS AN ELECTION YEAR FOR 18 COUNTY OFFICIALS. 19
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
- 20 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety,
- 21 has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members
- 22 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from
- 23 the date it is enacted.
