HOUSE BILL 56

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Transportation

4 24-108.

5 (c) (1) Except on interstate highways, a vehicle carrying agricultural <u>FARM</u> 6 products as defined under § 10-601 of the Agriculture Article or forest products that 7 have been loaded in fields or other off-highway locations is permitted an axle load 8 limit tolerance of 10 percent.

9 (2) Except on interstate highways, a single unit vehicle with 3 axles, or a 10 combination of vehicles with a trailer <u>SEMITRAILER NOT TRAILER</u> less than 32 feet 11 long <u>OR A SEMITRAILER LESS THAN 45 FEET LONG</u>, either registered as a farm vehicle 12 or carrying agricultural <u>FARM</u> products as defined under § 10-601 of the Agriculture 13 Article that were loaded in fields or other off-highway locations, is permitted an axle 14 load limit tolerance of 5 percent from § 24-109(b) and (c) of this subtitle, except 15 during harvest time when a tolerance of 15 percent from § 24-109(b) and (c) of this 16 subtitle is permitted for a vehicle carrying [the following] agricultural products-<u>[</u>:

(i) Wheat, for the period from June 1 to August 15;

- (ii) Corn, for the period from July 1 to December 1; and

19 (iii) Soybeans, for the period from September 1 to December [1] <u>31;</u>
20 <u>AND THAT ARE LOADED AT THE HARVEST SITE.</u>

21(IV)VEGETABLE CROPS FOR THE PERIOD FROM JUNE 1 TO22OCTOBER 31.

23 (3) Except on interstate highways, a single unit vehicle with at least 3

24 axles or a combination of vehicles with a trailer length of less than 32 feet or a

25 semitrailer length of 45 feet or less carrying forest products that have been loaded in

26 forests or other similar off-highway locations is permitted an axle load limit tolerance

27 of 5 percent from § 24-109(b) and (c) of this subtitle.

28 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect29 July 1, 1998.
