14 15	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 30 (4) in the case of a volunteer fire fighter, volunteer fire fighting

- 32 member, has met a suitable standard of physical examination before becoming a fire
- 33 fighter, fire fighting instructor, rescue squad member, or advanced life support unit
