1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Recreation on Private Land - Historical and Cultural Reenactments**

3 FOR the purpose of expanding the definition of "educational purpose" in a certain
4 provision of law relating to protection of property owners of land used by others
5 for certain purposes; including in the definition organized visits for purposes of
6 participating in or observing historical and cultural reenactments; making
7 certain stylistic changes; and generally relating to immunity for certain
8 landowners.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Natural Resources

2 5-1101.

3 (c) "Educational purpose" includes [any of the following or any combination of
4 the following]:

5 (1) Nature study[.];

6 (2) [farm] FARM visitations for purposes of learning about the farming
7 operation[.];

8 (3) [practice] PRACTICE judging of livestock, dairy cattle, poultry, other
9 animals, agronomy crops, horticultural crops, or other farm products[.];

10 (4) [organized] ORGANIZED visits to farms by school children, 4-H
11 clubs, FFA clubs, and others as part of their educational programs[.];

12 (5) ORGANIZED VISITS FOR PURPOSES OF PARTICIPATING IN OR
13 OBSERVING HISTORICAL REENACTMENTS AS PART OF AN EDUCATIONAL OR
14 CULTURAL PROGRAM; and

15 (6) [viewing] OBSERVATION OF historical, archaeological, or scientific
16 sites.

18 Except as specifically recognized by or provided in § 5-1106 of this subtitle, an
19 owner of land who either directly or indirectly invites or permits without charge
20 persons to use the property for any recreational or educational purpose or to cut
21 firewood for personal use does not by this action:

22 (1) Extend any assurance that the premises are safe for any purpose;

23 (2) Confer upon the person the legal status of an invitee or licensee to
24 whom a duty of care is owed; or

25 (3) Assume responsibility for or incur liability as a result of any injury to
26 the person or property caused by an act of omission of the person.

27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
28 October 1, 1998.
