

- 24 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 25 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

### 1 **Article - Health Occupations** 2 2-302. 3 (a) To qualify for a license to practice audiology, an applicant shall be an 4 individual who meets the requirements of this section. 5 (b) The applicant shall be of good moral character. 6 (c) The applicant shall: 7 Hold a master's degree or its equivalent in audiology from an (1) (I) 8 educational institution which incorporates the academic course work and the 9 minimum hours of supervised training required by the regulations adopted by the 10 Board; and 11 [(2)] (II) Have completed the period of supervised postgraduate 12 professional practice in audiology as specified by the regulations adopted by the 13 Board; OR HOLD A DOCTORAL DEGREE IN AUDIOLOGY FROM AN EDUCATIONAL 14 (2)15 INSTITUTION WHICH INCORPORATES THE ACADEMIC COURSE WORK AND THE 16 MINIMUM HOURS OF SUPERVISED TRAINING REQUIRED BY THE REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE BOARD OR ITS EQUIVALENT. 18 Except as otherwise provided in this title, the applicant shall pass an 19 examination given or approved by the Board under this subtitle. 20 2-310. 21 (a) Subject to the provisions of this section, the Board shall issue a limited 22 license to practice audiology to an applicant who: 23 (1) Except for the examination and supervised postgraduate professional 24 practice in audiology, meets the license requirements under § 2-302 of this subtitle; 25 (2) Demonstrates to the satisfaction of the Board that for the term of the 26 limited license the applicant will practice audiology only under the supervision of an individual described under subsection (b)(2) of this section; 28 Submits an application to the Board on the form that the Board (3) 29 requires; and Pays to the Board the application fee set by the Board. 30 (4) 31 The purpose of a limited license is to permit an individual to practice 32 audiology while completing the licensing requirements of this title. 	OF THIS SUBTITLE, AN individual who holds [a certificate of clinical competence] NATIONAL CERTIFICATION in speech-language pathology from:
3	1. The American Speech-Language and Hearing Association; or
5	2. Any other organization acceptable to the Board.
6 7	(c) A limited license to practice speech-language pathology expires on the first anniversary of its effective date.
