4 FOR the purpose of altering certain requirements for an individual to qualify for a

5 license to practice audiology; authorizing holders of certain limited licenses to

- 6 practice in certain settings under the supervision of specified individuals;
- 7 authorizing the issuance of certain limited licenses to an individual who has
- 8 previously been issued a limited license; authorizing licensed speech-language

9 pathologists to delegate certain duties to an assistant under certain

10 circumstances; requiring the Board to adopt certain regulations; prohibiting

11 hearing aid dispensers from violating certain consumer protection laws; and

12 generally relating to the regulatory authority of the State Board of Examiners

13 for Audiologists, Hearing Aid Dispensers, and Speech-Language Pathologists.
