1 Article 33 - Election Code 2 3-202. 3 (a) (1) The statewide voter registration application shall: State the qualifications to become a registered voter; 4 (i) REQUIRE THE APPLICANT TO PROVIDE THE LAST FOUR DIGITS 5 (ii) 6 OF THE APPLICANT'S SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER: 7 (III)Require the signature of the applicant, subject to the penalties 8 of perjury, by which the applicant swears or affirms that the information contained in 9 the registration application is true and that the applicant meets all of the 10 qualifications to become a registered voter; 11 [(iii)] (IV) State the penalties for the submission of a false 12 application; 13 [(iv)] (V) State that if an individual declines to register, this fact 14 will remain confidential and be used only for voter registration purposes; State that if an individual registers to vote, the office at 15 [(v)] (VI) which the application is submitted will remain confidential and will be used only for voter registration purposes; 18 [(vi)] (VII) Notify the applicant that submission of the form to an 19 individual other than an official, employee, or agent of a local board does not assure 20 that the form will be filed or filed in a timely manner; 21 [(vii)] (VIII) Provide the applicant with the opportunity to cancel a 22 current registration; and 23 [(viii)] (IX) Use identically sized print for the information that is required to be stated by this paragraph.
