11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 (f) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, a custodian may deny 16 inspection of:

17 (i) records of investigations conducted by the Attorney General, a
18 State's Attorney, a city or county attorney, a police department, or a sheriff;

- 19 (ii) an investigatory file compiled for any other law enforcement,20 judicial, correctional, or prosecution purpose; or
- 21 (iii) records that contain intelligence information or security
- 22 procedures of the Attorney General, a State's Attorney, a city or county attorney, a
- 23 police department, a STATE OR local correctional facility, or a sheriff.
- 24 (2) A custodian may deny inspection by a person in interest only to the 25 extent that the inspection would:
