- of persons inside a private residence on the property under certain

- 8 another to conduct visual surveillance with a certain intent in certain private
- 9 places; providing that ownership is not a defense under certain circumstances;
- providing a certain defense; providing certain penalties; providing for a civil

- 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments

- 3 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 4 INDICATED:
- 5 (2), "CAMERA" INCLUDES ANY ELECTRONIC DEVICE THAT CAN BE USED 6 TO SURREPTITIOUSLY OBSERVE SURREPTITIOUSLY A PERSON.
- 7 (3) "VISUAL SURVEILLANCE" MEANS DELIBERATE, SURREPTITIOUS 8 OBSERVATION OF ANOTHER.

- 25 PURPOSES, INCLUDING ANY PORTION OF A DAY CARE HOME USED FOR THE CARE
- 26 AND CUSTODY OF A CHILD; OR
- 27 <u>(7)</u> <u>FILMING OF A PRIVATE RESIDENCE BY USING A CAMERA THAT IS</u>
- 28 NOT LOCATED ON THE REAL PROPERTY ON WHICH THE PRIVATE RESIDENCE IS
- 29 LOCATED.
- 30 (C) A PERSON MAY NOT PLACE OR OTHERWISE BRING, OR PROCURE ANOTHER
- 31 TO PLACE OR OTHERWISE BRING. A CAMERA ONTO ON REAL PROPERTY ON WHICH IS
- 32 LOCATED A PRIVATE RESIDENCE FOR PURPOSES OF CONDUCTING VISUAL
- 33 SURVEILLANCE DELIBERATE SURREPTITIOUS OBSERVATION OF A PERSON INSIDE

HOUSE BILL 170 1 (D) IT IS NOT A DEFENSE TO A PROSECUTION UNDER THIS SECTION (1) 2 THAT THE PERSON CHARGED IS THE OWNER OF THE PRIVATE RESIDENCE, IF THE 3 OWNER IS NOT AN ADULT RESIDENT OF THE PRIVATE RESIDENCE. A GOOD FAITH RELIANCE ON A COURT ORDER IS A COMPLETE 5 DEFENSE TO ANY CIVIL OR CRIMINAL ACTION BROUGHT UNDER THIS SECTION. A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR 6 (E) 7 AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$1,000 OR 8 IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT MORE THAN 30 DAYS OR BOTH. 9 A PERSON IN A PRIVATE RESIDENCE WHO WAS OBSERVED BY A CAMERA (F) 10 IN VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION HAS A CIVIL CAUSE OF ACTION AGAINST ANY 11 PERSON WHO PLACED OR OTHERWISE BROUGHT THE CAMERA, OR PROCURED 12 ANOTHER TO PLACE OR OTHERWISE BRING THE CAMERA, ONTO ON THE REAL 13 PROPERTY. IN AN ACTION UNDER THIS SUBSECTION, THE COURT MAY AWARD 14 DAMAGES AND REASONABLE ATTORNEYS' FEES.  12 PERSON TO CONDUCT ANY VISUAL SURVEILLANCE OF ANOTHER PERSON WHO IS IN
 13 A PRIVATE PLACE WITHOUT THE CONSENT OF THE PERSON IN THE PRIVATE PLACE.

- 26 (F) A PERSON WHO WAS SUBJECT TO VISUAL SURVEILLANCE IN VIOLATION
- 27 OF THIS SECTION HAS A CIVIL CAUSE OF ACTION AGAINST ANY PERSON WHO

- 29 AN ACTION UNDER THIS SUBSECTION, THE COURT MAY AWARD ACTUAL DAMAGES

- 31 (G) THIS SECTION DOES NOT ABROGATE OR LIMIT ANY LEGAL OR EQUITABLE
- 32 RIGHT OR REMEDY OTHERWISE AVAILABLE BY COMMON LAW OR STATUTE.
- 33 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be
- 34 construed only prospectively to offenses occurring and causes of action arising on or
- 35 after the effective date of this Act and may not be applied or interpreted to have any

- 1 effect on or application to offenses occurring and causes of action arising before the 2 effective date of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 4 October 1, 1998.
