- 10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 11 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 12 Article 41 - Governor - Executive and Administrative Departments

- 14 (e) Subject to the authority of the Secretary of Public Safety and Correctional
- 15 Services, the Commission is vested with the following powers, authority,
- 16 responsibilities, and duties:
- 17 (1) To prescribe standards for the approval and the continuation of
- 18 approval of all schools at which correctional, parole or probation entrance level and
- 19 in-service training courses required by the Commission shall be conducted including
- 20 but not limited to present existing State, regional, county and municipal training
- 21 schools;
- 22 (2) To approve and issue certificates of approval to such correctional
- 23 training schools, to inspect such schools from time to time, and to revoke for cause
- 24 any approval or certificate issued to such school;
- 25 (3) To prescribe the curriculum, the courses of study, attendance
- 26 requirements, eligibility to attend, equipment and facilities, and standards of
- 27 operation for such training schools;

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1 (4) To prescribe minimum qualifications for instructors at such schools 2 and to certify, as qualified, instructors for approved training schools and to issue 3 appropriate certificates to such instructors; 4 To certify correctional officers who have satisfactorily completed 5 training programs and to issue appropriate certificates to such correctional officers; To conduct and operate approved correctional training schools as 6 (6)7 defined in this subtitle; To appoint, with the approval of the Secretary of Public Safety and 8 (7) 9 Correctional Services,[: 10 (i) An] AN Executive Director, [who shall be a special appointment 11 in the State Personnel Management System and shall serve at the pleasure of the 12 Commission, perform general administrative functions, and receive the compensation 13 set by the Commission; and 14 A] A Deputy Director, and such other employees as it shall (ii) 15 deem necessary, to serve at its pleasure, who shall perform general administrative 16 and training management functions, and to fix their compensation; 17 To employ such other persons as may be necessary to carry out the (8) 18 provisions of this section, upon approval of the Secretary of Public Safety and 19 Correctional Services, and as provided for in the State budget; To promulgate with the approval of the Secretary of Public Safety and 20 21 Correctional Services, such rules and regulations as may be reasonably necessary or 22 appropriate to accomplish the purposes and objectives of this section; 23 To make a continuous study of correctional training methods and 24 procedures for all correctional schools and to consult with and accept the cooperation 25 of any recognized federal, State, or municipal correctional agency or educational 26 institution: 27 To consult and cooperate with universities, colleges and institutions (11)28 for the development of all general and specialized courses of study for correctional 29 officers as defined in this section; 30 To consult and cooperate with other departments and agencies of the (12)31 State concerned with correctional training; 32 To adopt regulations to establish and enforce standards for prior (13)33 substance abuse by persons applying for certification as a correctional officer; and 34 To perform such other acts as may be necessary or appropriate to 35 carry out its functions and duties as set forth in this section. SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 36 37 effect October 1, 1998.
