32 33 34 35 36	(2) (I) A trustee who is a member but not a retiree of [the Correctional Officers' Retirement System, the Employees' Pension System, the Employees' Retirement System, the Judges' Retirement System, the Legislative Pension Plan, the Local Fire and Police System, the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension Plan,] the State Police Retirement System[, the Teachers' Pension System, or the Teachers' Retirement System] at the time of election of the trustee may complete the term of office even if, during the term, the trustee becomes a retiree of the State system of which the trustee was a member at the time of election.				

- 1 (II) A TRUSTEE WHO IS A MEMBER BUT NOT A RETIREE OF THE
