19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

HOUSE BILL 200 1 **Article - Transportation** 2 2-103.4. 3 (a) Without regard to the laws of this State relating to other State employees, 4 the Secretary of Transportation may establish a human resources management 5 system for employees of the Department and its units. Any human resources 6 management system that the Secretary establishes under this section shall: 7 (1)Be based on merit: 8 (2) Include fair and equitable procedures for appointment, hiring, 9 promotion, layoff, removal, termination, redress of grievances, and reinstatement of 10 employees; and 11 Permit employees to participate in the pension and retirement 12 systems for employees of the State of Maryland authorized under Division II of the 13 State Personnel and Pensions Article or any other pension and retirement systems 14 authorized by law. 15 4-208. 16 There is a Maryland Transportation Authority Police Force. (a) 17 (b) (1) A Maryland Transportation Authority police officer has all the 18 powers granted to a peace officer and a police officer of this State. 19 However, the Maryland Transportation Authority police officer may 20 exercise these powers only on property owned, leased, or operated by or under the 21 control of the Maryland Transportation Authority and the Maryland Aviation 22 Administration. 23 The police officer may not exercise these powers on any other 24 property unless: 25 (i) Engaged in fresh pursuit of a suspected offender; Specially requested or permitted to do so in a political 26 (ii) subdivision by its chief executive officer or its chief police officer; 28 Specially requested or permitted to do so on property owned, (iii) 29 leased, or operated by or under the control of the Maryland Port Administration by its 30 chief police officer; or 31 (iv) Ordered to do so by the Governor. 32 In consultation with the Secretary of the State Police and the (c) (1)
