CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Office on Aging - Interagency Committee on Aging Services - Powers and**
3 **Duties**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Chairman of the Interagency Committee on Aging
5 Services to designate a certain number of meetings as executive meetings;
6 authorizing Committee members to designate representatives to attend certain
7 Committee meetings; and generally relating to the powers and duties of the
8 Interagency Committee on Aging Services.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **Article 70B - Office on Aging**

2 4A.

3 There is an Interagency Committee on Aging Services in the Executive
4 Department.

5 4B.

6 (a) The Interagency Committee on Aging Services consists of the following
7 members:

8 (1) The Director of the Office on Aging;

9 (2) The Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene;

10 (3) The Secretary of Human Resources;

11 (4) The Secretary of Transportation;

12 (5) The Secretary of Housing and Community Development;

13 (6) The Secretary of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation;

14 (7) The Director of the Governor's Office for Individuals with
15 Disabilities;16 (8) A representative from a local area agency on aging to be appointed by
17 the Governor from a list submitted by the Maryland Association of Area Agencies on
18 Aging; and

19 (9) A member of the general public to be appointed by the Governor.

20 (b) The representative from the local area agency and the general public
21 member shall serve a 2-year term and may be reappointed for 2 additional terms.22 (c) The Governor shall appoint the Chairman of the Interagency Committee
23 on Aging Services from among the agency heads who serve on the Committee.24 (d) An Executive Director shall serve as principal staff of the Interagency
25 Committee. The Executive Director shall be an employee of the Office on Aging. Each
26 member agency shall designate an employee as liaison with the Executive Director to
27 implement policies of the Committee and to monitor the expenditures of funds to
28 serve the elderly.

29 4C.

30 (a) In addition to any other powers granted and duties imposed by this
31 subtitle, the Interagency Committee on Aging Services has the powers and duties set
32 forth in this section.

1 (b) The Committee shall:

2 (1) [Meet at least quarterly during each year;

3 (2)] Develop and annually update a plan for providing coordinated health
4 services, social services, transportation, housing, and employment services to elderly
5 persons in this State consistent with the priorities established by the Office on Aging;

6 [(3)] (2) Establish appropriate interagency agreements and promulgate
7 necessary rules and regulations to:

8 (i) Implement and coordinate aging services consistent with the
9 Interagency Committee plan;

10 (ii) Maximize the sharing of agency resources for services to the
11 elderly;

12 (iii) Consolidate planning and evaluation efforts at the State and
13 local level; and

14 (iv) Coordinate and expedite the delivery of services to the elderly
15 by providing technical assistance to local agencies;

16 [(4)] (3) Assist county agencies to establish local interagency committees
17 composed of the directors of the local health department, department of social
18 services, area agency on aging, and officials from housing, transportation, mental
19 health, employment, and economic development agencies. These committees shall
20 coordinate and expedite the delivery of services to the elderly at the local level; and

21 [(5)] (4) Annually on or before a date set by the Governor, develop and
22 present to the Governor and the General Assembly a consolidated operating budget
23 for aging services that:

24 (i) Sets forth the relevant portions of the operating budget of any
25 agency responsible for aging services; and

26 (ii) Is consistent with the Interagency Committee plan for
27 providing coordinated health services, social services, transportation, housing, and
28 employment services to elderly persons in this State.

29 (c) (1) THE COMMITTEE SHALL MEET AT LEAST QUARTERLY DURING EACH
30 YEAR.

31 (2) THE CHAIRMAN SHALL DESIGNATE AT LEAST ONE MEETING EACH
32 YEAR AS AN EXECUTIVE MEETING.

33 (3) A COMMITTEE MEMBER MAY SEND A DESIGNEE TO REPRESENT THE
34 MEMBER AT ANY MEETING THAT IS NOT AN EXECUTIVE MEETING.

1 (D) In the event the members of the Interagency Committee should fail to
2 agree on a plan for services to elderly persons, the chairman of the Committee shall
3 refer the matter to the Governor for resolution.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
5 effect October 1, 1998.
