# 9 Chapter 208 of the Acts of 1992

- 10 [SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the City of Baltimore
- 11 shall be responsible for providing at least \$600,000 in each fiscal year to support
- 12 education at the Baltimore City Community College. Of this amount, in each fiscal
- 13 year, at least \$300,000 shall be expended for tuition reimbursement or scholarships to
- 14 attend classes at the Baltimore City Community College and the remaining balance
- 15 shall be expended in a manner consistent with the educational mission of the
- 16 Baltimore City Community College. The source of the \$600,000 is not limited to tax or
- 17 fee revenues generated by the City of Baltimore.]
- 18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 19 effect July 1, 1998.
