18 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "PERSONAL IDENTIFYING INFORMATION" MEANS THE
19 NAME, ADDRESS, TELEPHONE NUMBER, DRIVER'S LICENSE NUMBER, SOCIAL
20 SECURITY NUMBER, PLACE OF EMPLOYMENT, EMPLOYEE IDENTIFICATION NUMBER,

### HOUSE BILL 262

1 (C) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR

2 AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE OF NOT LESS THAN \$1,000 AND NOT

3 MORE THAN \$10,000 OR IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT MORE THAN 1 YEAR OR BOTH.
