Handguns - Child Resistance Standards

3 FOR the purpose of requiring a handgun sold after a certain date to meet State

- 4 performance standards for child resistance; requiring that performance
- 5 standards for child resistance be designed so that a child under a certain age
- 6 would have significant difficulty in firing a handgun; requiring that a certain
- 7 type of device be attached to a handgun; requiring that the Secretary of State
- 8 Police adopt regulations by a certain date to carry out this Act; and generally
- 9 relating to performance standards for handguns regarding child resistance.

19 (A) ON OR AFTER OCTOBER 1, 2000, A PERSON MAY NOT SELL A PISTOL,
20 REVOLVER, OR OTHER HANDGUN UNLESS THE HANDGUN MEETS STATE
21 PERFORMANCE STANDARDS FOR CHILD RESISTANCE.

22 (B) THE PERFORMANCE STANDARDS FOR CHILD RESISTANCE:

23 (1) SHALL BE DESIGNED SO THAT A CHILD UNDER 6 YEARS OF AGE
24 WOULD HAVE SIGNIFICANT DIFFICULTY IN FIRING A HANDGUN; AND

25 (2) SHALL REQUIRE A GRIP-SAFETY MECHANISM, A COMBINATION
26 LOCK MECHANISM, OR OTHER DEVICE TO BE ATTACHED TO A HANDGUN.

ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 1999, THE SECRETARY OF STATE POLICE SHALL 1 (C) 2 ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS SECTION.
