- 7 before being certified; requiring that the course of study include certain topics;
- 8 requiring the Board to certify a pharmacist after the pharmacist successfully

- administering a drug and after the drug is administered; requiring a pharmacist

1 2	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

	(b) [Any] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § 12-508(F) OF THE HEALTH OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE, ANY drug which bears a cautionary label warning against dispensing without a prescription under federal law shall be dispensed only:
8 9	(1) Upon the written prescription of a practitioner licensed by law to administer such drugs, or
10 11	(2) Upon the oral prescription of such practitioner, which shall be reduced to writing and filed by the pharmacist, or
	(3) By refilling any such written or oral prescription if such refilling is authorized by the prescriber, either in the original prescription or by oral direction. Such authorization must be reduced to writing and filed by the pharmacist.

1 (VII) ADMINISTERING PRESCRIPTION OR NONPRESCRIPTION DRUGS 2 BY DIRECT APPLICATION TO THE BODY OF A PATIENT BY ANY MEANS, INCLUDING 3 INJECTION, INHALATION, AND TOPICAL APPLICATION. "Practice pharmacy" does not include the operations of a person who 5 holds a permit issued under §§ 12-601 and 12-602 of this title. 6 12-508. A PHARMACIST SHALL BE CERTIFIED BY THE BOARD UNDER THIS 7 (A) 8 SECTION BEFORE THE PHARMACIST MAY ADMINISTER A PRESCRIPTION OR 9 NONPRESCRIPTION DRUG TO A PATIENT. 10 (2) TO BE CERTIFIED BY THE BOARD, A PHARMACIST SHALL 11 SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETE A COURSE OF STUDY THAT THE BOARD APPROVES IN 12 CONSULTATION WITH THE STATE BOARD OF NURSING AND THAT IS CONSISTENT 13 WITH NATIONAL STANDARDS. 14 THE COURSE OF STUDY SHALL REQUIRE A PHARMACIST TO (3) 15 DEMONSTRATE COMPETENCY IN: (I) PATIENT ASSESSMENT TECHNIQUES; 16 17 ADMINISTRATION METHODS AND SITES: (II)18 (III)EMERGENCY PROCEDURES; 19 (IV) PATIENT MONITORING PROCEDURES; 20 (V) THE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL OF MEDICAL WASTE; 21 (VI) THE USE OF UNIVERSAL PRECAUTIONS; AND 22 ANY OTHER SUBJECT THAT THE BOARD REQUIRES. (VII) 23 ON RECEIPT OF EVIDENCE THAT A PHARMACIST HAS SUCCESSFULLY (B) (1) 24 COMPLETED THE COURSE OF STUDY REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS 25 SECTION, THE BOARD SHALL CERTIFY THE PHARMACIST TO ADMINISTER 26 PRESCRIPTION OR NONPRESCRIPTION DRUGS. 27 THE CERTIFICATION TO ADMINISTER PRESCRIPTION OR (2) 28 NONPRESCRIPTION DRUGS SHALL SPECIFY EACH DRUG OR DRUG CLASS THAT THE 29 PHARMACIST MAY ADMINISTER AND THE SITE AT WHICH THE ADMINISTRATION MAY 30 OCCUR. 31 THE BOARD MAY REQUIRE A PHARMACIST TO ENTER INTO A 32 COLLABORATIVE PRACTICE AGREEMENT BEFORE THE PHARMACIST ADMINISTERS A 33 SPECIFIED DRUG.

35 WITHOUT A PRESCRIPTION ONLY IF:

HOUSE BILL 267 1 (C) UNLESS A CERTIFICATION TO ADMINISTER PRESCRIPTION OR 2 NONPRESCRIPTION DRUGS IS RENEWED FOR A 2-YEAR TERM AS PROVIDED BY 3 REGULATION, THE CERTIFICATION EXPIRES: 4 (1) TWO YEARS AFTER THE DATE THE CERTIFICATION IS ISSUED; OR IF EARLIER, THE EXPIRATION DATE OF THE LICENSE OF THE 6 PHARMACIST. A PHARMACIST SHALL: 15 ENSURE THAT THE DRUG BE ADMINISTERED IN PRIVATE: (I) MAINTAIN ADEQUATE EMERGENCY EQUIPMENT, SUPPLIES, (II)16 17 AND SERVICES TO ENSURE PATIENT SAFETY: ENSURE THE SAFE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL OF MEDICAL (III)18 19 WASTE; (IV) COMPLY WITH THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL 20 21 GUIDELINES ON UNIVERSAL PRECAUTIONS; AND 22 (V) COMPLY WITH ANY OTHER REQUIREMENTS THAT THE BOARD 23 ESTABLISHES. AFTER ADMINISTERING A PRESCRIPTION OR NONPRESCRIPTION 25 DRUG TO A PATIENT, A PHARMACIST SHALL: (I) IN A READILY RETRIEVABLE FORM, MAKE A RECORD OF THE 27 ADMINISTRATION OF THE DRUG AND ENSURE THAT THE RECORD REMAIN PRIVATE: PROVIDE THE PATIENT WITH A WRITTEN RECORD OF THE 28 (II)29 ADMINISTRATION OF THE DRUG; AND

EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (G) OF THIS SECTION, A

A PHARMACIST MAY ADMINISTER A PRESCRIPTION DRUG TO A PATIENT

32 PHARMACIST MAY NOT ADMINISTER A PRESCRIPTION DRUG UNLESS A VALID

MONITOR THE PATIENT FOR AN APPROPRIATE PERIOD OF TIME.

- 1 (1) THE PHARMACIST HAS WRITTEN, SIGNED AUTHORIZATION FROM A 2 PRESCRIBER THAT SPECIFIES:
- 3 (I) THE DRUG TO BE ADMINISTERED; AND
- 4 (II) THE CRITERIA THAT A PATIENT MUST MEET BEFORE THE
- 5 PHARMACIST MAY ADMINISTER THE DRUG TO THE PATIENT; AND
- 6 (2) THE DRUG WAS DISPENSED FOR IMMEDIATE ADMINISTRATION TO 7 THE PATIENT.
- 8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 9 October 1, 1998.
