- 17 (a) The Office on Aging is created as part of the Executive Department. The 18 Office consists of a Director on Aging and the Commission on Aging.
- 19 (b) The Director on Aging shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of
- 20 the Governor and be directly responsible to him. The Director is responsible for the
- 21 operation of the Office and shall establish guidelines and procedures to promote the
- 22 orderly and efficient administration of the Office. He shall receive the salary provided
- 23 in the State budget.
- 24 (c) The Office shall have the assistants, consultants, and employees provided 25 in the State budget.]
