1 (m) Except for those provisions of this section that by their very nature cannot 2 apply, this section applies to a traffic control signal placed at a location other than an 3 intersection. Each stop required by the signal shall be made at a sign or marking on 4 the pavement indicating where the stop shall be made or, if there is no sign or

5 marking, at the signal.

6 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 October 1, 1998.
