- 23 THE COMMISSION STATING THE REASON FOR THE DENIAL OF PAYMENT, IF the
- 24 Commission finds that the employer or [its] insurer has failed, without good cause,
- 25 to pay for treatment or services required by § 9-660 of this Part IX of this subtitle
- 26 within 45 days after the [Commission, by order, finally approves] RECEIPT OF AN
- 27 ITEMIZED STATEMENT FROM THE PROVIDER REQUESTING PAYMENT OF the fee or
- 28 charge for the treatment or services RENDERED, the Commission may impose a fine
- 29 on the employer or insurer, not exceeding 20% of the amount of the approved fee or
