# A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

# **Industrial Hygienists - Title Protection**

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting an individual from representing that the individual is

- 4 an industrial hygienist, a certified industrial hygienist, or industrial hygienist
- 5 in training unless the individual meets certain qualifications; prohibiting a
- 6 business entity from identifying, representing, or advertising itself as a provider
- 7 of industrial hygiene services or a provider of industrial hygiene services
- 8 furnished by certified industrial hygienists or industrial hygienists in training
- 9 unless the business entity meets certain qualifications; establishing certain
- 10 penalties; defining certain terms; specifying legislative intent; and generally
- 11 relating to certain qualifications for individuals and business entities using
- 12 certain titles or making certain representations relating to the provision of
- 13 industrial hygiene services.

14 BY adding to

- 15 Article Business Regulation
- 16 The new subtitle designation "Subtitle 1. Tourism Services" to immediately
- 17 precede Section 19-101; and Section 19-201 through 19-206 to be under
- 18 the new subtitle "Subtitle 2. Industrial Hygienists"
- 19 Annotated Code of Maryland
- 20 (1992 Volume and 1997 Supplement)

21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

22 MARYLAND, That the subtitle designation "Subtitle 1. Tourism Services" be added to

- 23 immediately precede Section 19-101 of Article Business Regulation of the
- 24 Annotated Code of Maryland.

25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland 26 read as follows:

4 (A) 5 INDICATE	IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS ED.

6 (B) "AMERICAN BOARD OF INDUSTRIAL HYGIENE" MEANS A NONPROFIT
7 CORPORATION INCORPORATED IN 1960 IN PENNSYLVANIA TO IMPROVE THE
8 PRACTICE OF THE PROFESSION OF INDUSTRIAL HYGIENE BY CERTIFYING
9 INDIVIDUALS WHO MEET ITS EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE STANDARDS AND PASS
10 ITS EXAMINATION.

(C) "INDUSTRIAL HYGIENE" MEANS THE APPLIED SCIENCE DEVOTED TO THE
 ANTICIPATION, RECOGNITION, EVALUATION, AND CONTROL OF ENVIRONMENTAL
 FACTORS, STRESSORS, PHYSICAL HAZARDS, AND CHEMICAL EXPOSURES
 ASSOCIATED WITH WORK AND WORK OPERATIONS THAT MAY CAUSE SICKNESS,
 IMPAIRED HEALTH AND WELL-BEING, OR SIGNIFICANT DISCOMFORT AMONG
 WORKERS AND THE MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC.

17 (D) "INDUSTRIAL HYGIENIST" MEANS A PERSON WHO PRACTICES INDUSTRIAL 18 HYGIENE.

IT IS THE INTENT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO PROVIDE LEGAL
RECOGNITION TO THE PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE OF INDUSTRIAL HYGIENE FOR THE
PURPOSE OF ASSURING GOVERNMENT, BUSINESSES, AND THE PUBLIC THAT ONLY:

(1) INDIVIDUALS WHO MEET THE QUALIFICATIONS OF § 19-204(A) OF

3 (1) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO DOES NOT IDENTIFY, ADVERTISE, OR

12 (A) (1) AN INDIVIDUAL MAY NOT USE THE TITLE "INDUSTRIAL HYGIENIST",
13 THE INITIALS "IH" OR "I.H.", OR ANY VARIATION OF THOSE TERMS TO IDENTIFY,
14 ADVERTISE, OR REPRESENT, BY ANY MEANS OF COMMUNICATION, THAT THE
15 INDIVIDUAL IS AN INDUSTRIAL HYGIENIST, UNLESS THE INDIVIDUAL HAS ACQUIRED
16 COMPETENCE IN INDUSTRIAL HYGIENE, THROUGH SPECIAL STUDIES AND TRAINING

7 TO IDENTIFY, ADVERTISE, OR REPRESENT THAT THE INDIVIDUAL IS AN INDUSTRIAL

27 (C) A BUSINESS ENTITY MAY NOT IDENTIFY, ADVERTISE, OR REPRESENT
28 ITSELF AS A PROVIDER OF INDUSTRIAL HYGIENE SERVICES FURNISHED BY
29 INDUSTRIAL HYGIENISTS IN TRAINING UNLESS THE INDUSTRIAL HYGIENE
30 SERVICES ARE PROVIDED BY INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE QUALIFIED UNDER § 9-204(C) OF
31 THIS SUBTITLE TO USE THE TITLE "INDUSTRIAL HYGIENIST IN TRAINING".

A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SUBTITLE IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND
 ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$1,000.
