- 16 (a) A person who fails to comply with the relief granted in an ex parte order
- 17 under § 4-505(a)(2)(i), (ii), (iii), (iv), or (v) of this subtitle or in a protective order
- 18 under § 4-506(d)(1), (2), (3), (4), or (5) of this subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and
- 19 on conviction is subject, for each offense, to a fine not exceeding [\$500] \$10,000 or
- 20 imprisonment not exceeding [90 days] 3 YEARS or both.
- 21 (b) An officer shall arrest with or without a warrant and take into custody a
- 22 person whom the officer has probable cause to believe is in violation of an ex parte
- 23 order or protective order in effect at the time of the violation.
