AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, for members of the Judges' Retirement System who transfer from the Employees' Pension System, the Board of Trustees shall transfer to the Judges' Retirement System the member contributions and employer contributions that were made to the Employees' Pension System on behalf of those members who transferred, plus the interest earned on those contributions through the date of transfer.
