SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages 2 5-201. 3 (p) (1) This subsection applies only in Kent County. 4 (2) The annual license fee is \$1,000. 5 Any restaurant qualifying under § 6-201(p)(2)(ii) AND (III) of this (3) 6 article may apply to the Board of License Commissioners for a special Class B beer 7 and light wine license. 8 6-201. 9 (p) (1) (i) This subsection applies only in Kent County. 10 (2) (ii) To qualify for licensure under this subsection, the restaurant 11 shall: 12 1. Be fully equipped with a proper and adequate dining 13 room; 2. 14 Have sufficient facilities for preparing and serving meals 15 to the public; and 16 3. Be approved by the Board. 17 (iii) When operating under this license, a holder's average daily 18 receipts from the sale of food shall comprise at least 60 percent of the average daily 19 receipts of the business. 20 12-108. 21 This subsection applies in the following jurisdictions: (f) (1) 22 (i) Dorchester County; 23 (ii) Howard County; (III) 24 KENT COUNTY; and 25 [(iii)] (IV) Montgomery County. The granting of probation before judgment to a licensee or employee 26 27 of the licensee for violating subsection (a) of this section does not bar the Board of 28 License Commissioners from proceeding administratively against the licensee for the 29 violation. 30 SECTION 2.
