20 21	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

26 27 28	The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall have full power and authority to exercise all of the powers heretofore or hereafter granted to it by the Constitution of Maryland or by any Public General or Public Local Laws of the State of Maryland; and in particular, without limitation upon the foregoing, shall have power by ordinance, or such other method as may be provided for in its Charter, subject to the provisions of said Constitution and Public General Laws:

- 2 (A) TO ESTABLISH BY ORDINANCE A CITIZENS' REVIEW BOARD OF THE
- 3 BALTIMORE CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT TO PROVIDE A PUBLIC FORUM TO EXAMINE
- 4 COMPLAINTS OF ALLEGED MISCONDUCT BY POLICE OFFICERS OF THE BALTIMORE
- 5 CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT.
- 6 (B) AN ORDINANCE ADOPTED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL ESTABLISH:
- 7 (1) THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD AND THE APPOINTMENT,
- 8 REMOVAL, AND TERM OF OFFICE OF THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD; AND
- 9 (2) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, THE DUTIES AND 10 PROCEDURES OF THE BOARD.
- 11 (C) (1) A CITIZENS' REVIEW BOARD ESTABLISHED BY ORDINANCE UNDER
- 12 THIS SECTION SHALL RECEIVE ALL COMPLAINTS ALLEGING POLICE MISCONDUCT.
- 13 (2) IN THE DISCRETION OF THE BOARD, THE BOARD MAY:
- 14 (I) SELECT INDIVIDUAL COMPLAINTS OR INCIDENTS RECEIVED
- 15 UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION TO INVESTIGATE; AND
- 16 (II) STUDY ISSUES AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE MAYOR
- 17 AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE AND THE CHIEF OF THE BALTIMORE CITY POLICE
- 18 DEPARTMENT REGARDING COMMUNITY AND POLICE RELATIONS.
- 19 (3) BASED ON THE INVESTIGATIVE FINDINGS OF THE BOARD, THE
- 20 BOARD MAY ISSUE RECOMMENDATIONS ON THE APPROPRIATE DISPOSITION OF A
- 21 COMPLAINT TO THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE AND THE CHIEF OF
- 22 THE BALTIMORE CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT.
- 23 (4) ANY REVIEW, INVESTIGATION, OR RECOMMENDATION OF THE
- 24 BOARD UNDER THIS SUBSECTION MAY NOT LIMIT OR BE INCONSISTENT WITH ANY
- 25 PROVISIONS OF THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS' BILL OF RIGHTS IN ARTICLE 27
- 26 OF THE ANNOTATED CODE OF MARYLAND OR ANY OTHER PROVISIONS OF STATE

- 28 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
