A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Vehicle Laws - Farm Vehicles - "Farm Product" Defined

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering permissible uses of certain vehicle classifications under
- 4 the Maryland Vehicle Law by modifying a definition of "farm products" to
- 5 include fertilizer, mulch, peat, and trees for replanting.
- 6 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
- 7 Article Transportation
- 8 Section 13-911
- 9 Annotated Code of Maryland
- 10 (1992 Replacement Volume and 1997 Supplement)
- 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 13 Article Transportation
- 14 13-911.
- 15 (a) In this part the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 16 (b) "Farmer" means any person who:
- 17 (1) Raises, grows, and produces farm products on a farm of at least 3
- 18 acres; or
- 19 (2) Keeps at least 25 hives of bees for the pollination of orchards and
- 20 farm crops and the commercial production of honey.
- 21 (c) "Farm products" include food for consumption by humans or livestock,
- 22 tobacco, shrubbery, flowers, plants, TREES FOR REPLANTING, seed, FERTILIZER,
- 23 MULCH, PEAT, livestock and livestock products, poultry and poultry products, farm
- 24 wood lot products, and fibers.
- 25 (d) "Farm vehicle" means a vehicle that:

- 1 (1) Is owned by a farmer;
- 2 (2) Is used only in the farmer's farming business and about the farmer's
- 3 farm home and in hauling farm products and the labor, supplies, equipment, and 4 other materials necessary for the operation of the farm and farm home; and
- 5 (3) Is not used to haul farm products previously acquired by the farmer 6 for resale or to haul farm products for hire for another person who is not a farmer.
- 7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 8 October 1, 1998.
