BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12 13 MARYLAND, (Three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses 14 concurring), That it be proposed that the Constitution of Maryland read as follows: 15 **Article III - Legislative Department** 16 3. 17 (A) The State shall be divided by law into legislative districts for the (1) 18 election of members of the Senate and the House of Delegates. Each legislative 19 district shall contain one (1) Senator and three (3) Delegates. 20 [Nothing herein shall prohibit the subdivision of any one] UNLESS 21 OTHERWISE PROVIDED BY LAW, AND TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE, EACH 22 LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT SHALL BE CONTAINED WHOLLY WITHIN A COUNTY, AND ONE 23 or more of the legislative districts MAY BE SUBDIVIDED for the purpose of electing 24 members of the House of Delegates into three (3) single-member delegate districts or 25 one (1) single-member delegate district and one (1) multi-member delegate district.

27 OF ITS POPULATION RESIDES IN ONE COUNTY AND THE REMAINING PORTION OF ITS 28 POPULATION RESIDES IN ANOTHER COUNTY, THE LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT SHALL BE

IF A LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT IS CONFIGURED SO THAT THE MAJORITY

- 1 SUBDIVIDED INTO DELEGATE DISTRICTS SO THAT THE LESSER POPULATION IS
- 2 CONTAINED WITHIN A SINGLE-MEMBER DELEGATE DISTRICT.
- 3 (2) A SINGLE-MEMBER DELEGATE DISTRICT, CREATED TO MEET THE
- 4 REQUIREMENTS OF PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION, MAY CONTAIN
- 5 POPULATION FROM BOTH COUNTIES IN ORDER TO MEET EQUAL POPULATION
- 6 STANDARDS.
- 7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly
- 8 determines that the amendment to the Constitution of Maryland proposed by this Act
- 9 affects multiple jurisdictions and that the provisions of Article XIV, Section 1 of the
- 10 Constitution concerning local approval of constitutional amendments do not apply.
- 11 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the aforegoing section
- 12 proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of Maryland shall be submitted to the
- 13 legal and qualified voters of this State at the next general election to be held in
- 14 November, 1998 for their adoption or rejection in pursuance of directions contained in
- 15 Article XIV of the Constitution of this State. At that general election, the vote on this
- 16 proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot
- 17 there shall be printed the words "For the Constitutional Amendments" and "Against
- 18 the Constitutional Amendments," as now provided by law. Immediately after the
- 19 election, all returns shall be made to the Governor of the vote for and against the
- 20 proposed amendment, as directed by Article XIV of the Constitution, and further
- 21 proceedings had in accordance with Article XIV.
