SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## **HOUSE BILL 550** 1 **Article 41 - Governor - Executive and Administrative Departments** 2 18-205. 3 (c) The purpose of the Trust Fund is to receive and hold the proceeds (1) 4 from the sale or long-term lease of property and equipment [that results from the 5 closure] of a Developmental Disabilities Administration facility or a Mental Hygiene 6 Administration facility. 7 For purposes of this section, proceeds are the gross proceeds minus 8 the costs associated with the sale, lease, or disposition of property and equipment, as 9 determined by the Department of General Services. 10 Chapter 646 of the Acts of 1996 11 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 12 effect June 1, 1996. [Except for the provisions of Section 2 of this Act, this Act shall 13 remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of May 31, 1999, with no 14 further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no 15 further force and effect.] 16 Chapter 675 of the Acts of 1996 17 SECTION 5.
