13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
15 Article - State Personnel and Pensions

17 (a) This section applies to all employees, including temporary employees, of all
18 units in the Executive, Judicial, and Legislative Branches of State government,
19 including any unit with an independent personnel system.

20 (b) On request, an employee subject to this section may be entitled to disaster 21 service leave with pay if:

- 1 (1) the employee is certified by the American Red Cross as a disaster 2 service volunteer; and the American Red Cross requests the services of the employee during 3 (2) 4 a disaster that[: 5 (i) occurs in the State or a state that is contiguous to the State; and is designated at Level II or above in the regulations and 6 (ii)] 7 procedures of the National Office of the American Red Cross. 8 An employee may use up to 15 days of disaster service leave in any (c)
- 9 12-month period only after obtaining approval from the employee's appointing 10 authority.
- 11 (d) For purposes of workers' compensation and the Maryland Tort Claims Act, 12 while an employee is using disaster service leave, the employee is deemed not to be a 13 State employee.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 15 October 1, 1998.
