3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the State Board of Nursing to take certain actions

4 against certain licensed nurses who perform acts beyond their knowledge<del>,</del> and

6 certain licensed nurses who direct other nurses to perform acts beyond their

7 knowledge, and skills, and abilities; authorizing the Board to take certain

8 actions against certain licensed nurses who direct other nurses to delegate to

9 individuals certain nursing tasks that are either nondelegable or beyond the

	(a) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 8-317 of this subtitle, the Board may deny a license to any applicant, reprimand any licensee, place any licensee on probation, or suspend or revoke the license of a licensee if the applicant or licensee:
	(27) Practices registered nursing or licensed practical nursing without a license before obtaining or renewing a license, including any period when the license or a temporary license of the applicant or licensee has lapsed; [or]

11 (28)After failing to renew a license or after a temporary license has 12 lapsed, commits any act that would be grounds for disciplinary action under this 13 section[.];

THE NURSE LACKS THE KNOWLEDGE, AND SKILLS, AND ABILITIES 31 (1)32 TO PERFORM THE NURSING TASK; OR

33 (2) THE PATIENT'S CONDITION DOES NOT ALLOW DELEGATION OF THE 34 NURSING TASK.

2 (a) Except for a violation of § 8-707 of this subtitle, a person who violates any 3 provision of this subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a 4 fine not exceeding \$5,000 or imprisonment not exceeding 1 year or both.

5 (b) A person who violates any provision of § 8-707 of this subtitle is guilty of a 6 misdemeanor and on conviction is subject:

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(1) For a first offense, to a fine not exceeding \$100; and

8 (2) For any subsequent violation of the same provision, to a fine not 9 exceeding \$500 or imprisonment not exceeding 6 months or both.

(C) (1) SUBJECT TO THE APPROPRIATE HEARING AND APPEALS
PROVISIONS, THE APPROPRIATE HEALTH OCCUPATIONS BOARD, ON THE
AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF THE MAJORITY OF ITS MEMBERS, MAY REPRIMAND A
LICENSEE OR CERTIFICATE HOLDER, PLACE A LICENSEE OR CERTIFICATE HOLDER
ON PROBATION, OR SUSPEND OR REVOKE A LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE OF A PERSON
WHO VIOLATES ANY PROVISION OF § 8-701 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

(2) A PERSON WHO IS LICENSED, CERTIFIED, OR OTHERWISE
AUTHORIZED TO PROVIDE HEALTH CARE SERVICES UNDER THIS ARTICLE IS NOT
SUBJECT TO THE PENALTY PROVIDED IN SUBSECTIONS (A) AND (B) OF THIS SECTION
FOR A VIOLATION OF § 8-701(C) AND (D) OF THIS SUBTITLE.
