21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings

- 3 As used in this subtitle, the following terms have the meanings indicated:
- 4 (18) "TELEMARKETING FRAUD" MEANS A FRAUDULENT PRACTICE
- 5 ENGAGED IN AS A PART OF A PATTERN OF USING ONE OR MORE TELEPHONES FOR
- 6 THE PURPOSE OF ASKING A PERSON:
- 7 (I) TO PAY MONEY AS A CONDITION TO THAT PERSON RECEIVING
- 8 OR POSSIBLY RECEIVING A PRODUCT, SERVICE, DISCOUNT, OR PRIZE; OR
- 9 (II) TO CONTRIBUTE MONEY FOR A CHARITABLE OR BENEVOLENT
- 10 PURPOSE.
- 11 (18) "TELEPHONE SOLICITATION THEFT" MEANS CONDUCT OF A PERSON
- 12 THAT CONSTITUTES THE OFFENSE OF THEFT OR ATTEMPTED THEFT BY THE USE OF
- 13 A TELEPHONE TO SOLICIT THE PAYMENT OF MONEY.

- 15 (a) Except as otherwise specifically provided in this subtitle it is unlawful for 16 any person to:
- 17 (1) Wilfully intercept, endeavor to intercept, or procure any other person
- 18 to intercept or endeavor to intercept, any wire, oral, or electronic communication;
- 19 (2) Wilfully disclose, or endeavor to disclose, to any other person the
- 20 contents of any wire, oral, or electronic communication, knowing or having reason to
- 21 know that the information was obtained through the interception of a wire, oral, or
- 22 electronic communication in violation of this subtitle; or
- 23 (3) Wilfully use, or endeavor to use, the contents of any wire, oral, or
- 24 electronic communication, knowing or having reason to know that the information
- 25 was obtained through the interception of a wire, oral, or electronic communication in

- 27 (b) Any person who violates subsection (a) of this section is guilty of a felony
- 28 and is subject to imprisonment for not more than 5 years or a fine of not more than
- 29 \$10,000, or both.
- 30 (c) (9) IT IS LAWFUL UNDER THIS SUBTITLE FOR A PERSON TO INTERCEPT A

- 34 (I) THE PERSON IS A GOVERNMENT INVESTIGATOR AN
