BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 14 **Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments** 15 389. It shall be unlawful for any person to remove, deface or obliterate any 16 manufacturer's serial number punched or affixed by plate to any manufactured 18 article or product where the intent or purpose is to prevent the tracing or 19 identification of said article or product. 20 It shall be unlawful for any person knowingly to retain in his possession or 21 to offer for sale any manufactured article or product from which the manufacturer's 22 serial number has been so removed, defaced or obliterated. IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON: 23 (C)24 (1) TO SELL OR POSSESS STOLEN:

MANUFACTURED SERIAL NUMBERS; OR

VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION PLATES OR LABELS; OR

- 1 (2) TO POSSESS MANUFACTURED SERIAL NUMBERS OR VEHICLE
- 2 IDENTIFICATION PLATES OR LABELS WITH THE INTENT FOR THE SERIAL NUMBERS
- 3 OR VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION PLATES OR LABELS TO BE AFFIXED TO STOLEN
- 4 PROPERTY OR TO BE USED FOR FRAUDULENT PURPOSES.
- 5 [(c)] (D) Any person who violates any provision of this section shall be deemed
- 6 guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not more than
- 7 [\$300.00] \$500 or imprisoned not exceeding [one year] 18 MONTHS or be both fined
- 8 and imprisoned for each and every offense.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 10 effect July 1, 1998.
