19 (a) The driver of each vehicle involved in an accident that results in bodily

20 injury to for death of] any ANOTHER person immediately shall stop the vehicle as

21 close as possible to the scene of the accident, without obstructing traffic more than

22 necessary.

25 at the scene of the accident until [he] THE DRIVER has complied with § 20-104 of this

28 (A) THE DRIVER OF EACH VEHICLE INVOLVED IN AN ACCIDENT THAT

29 RESULTS IN THE DEATH OF ANY PERSON IMMEDIATELY SHALL STOP THE VEHICLE

30 AS CLOSE AS POSSIBLE TO THE SCENE OF THE ACCIDENT, WITHOUT OBSTRUCTING 31 TRAFFIC MORE THAN NECESSARY.
