- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14
- 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 18 (A) The State Board, in exercising its authority under this subtitle, shall adopt
- 19 rules and regulations governing the procedures for its review, approval, certification,
- 20 and decertification of voting systems.
- 21 (B) THE REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL INCLUDE A
- 22 REQUIREMENT THAT EACH BOARD PROVIDE, AT EACH PRECINCT, AT LEAST ONE
- 23 VOTING STATION UTILIZING A VOTING SYSTEM WITH WHICH A BLIND OR VISUALLY
- 24 IMPAIRED VOTER CAN CAST VOTES WITHOUT ASSISTANCE FROM ANOTHER
- 25 INDIVIDUAL.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 26
- 27 July 1, 1998.
