1 (iv) Any initial capital contribution or similar fee, other than 2 assessments for common expenses, to be paid by unit owners to the council of unit 3 owners or vendor, and a statement of how the fees will be used;	
4 (6) A copy of any lease to which it is anticipated the unit owners or the 5 council of unit owners will be a party following closing;
