- 3 (b) (1) The Administration shall file each accident report and abstract of 4 court disposition records that it receives under the laws of this State.
- 5 (2) The Administration shall keep convenient records or make suitable
- 6 notations showing the convictions or traffic accidents in which each licensee has been
