Each of the following entities is subject to the budget and fiscal policies and 4 purchasing laws of the county in which it is located: 5 (1) Any county board of supervisors of elections; 6 Any State's Attorney's office; (2) 7 [Any] EXCEPT IN PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY, ANY sheriff's office; (3) 8 (4) Any county board of liquor license commissioners; or 9 (5) Any circuit court, but not the office of a clerk of court.
