14 Preamble

- WHEREAS, Approximately 3,400 Maryland women are stricken with breast
- 16 cancer each year and approximately 800 of them die from the disease; and
- WHEREAS, Early detection through mammography screening is by far the most
- 18 important tool medical science has in fighting breast cancer; and
- 19 WHEREAS, A mammography screening program conducted by the Health
- 20 Services Cost Review Commission for low-income underinsured and low-income
- 21 uninsured women age 40 years and over, which detected an estimated 500 cases of
- 22 breast cancer in nearly 4 years, expired on June 30, 1997 with no comprehensive
- 23 replacement program in place for thousands of women who need mammograms, but
- 24 cannot afford them; and

- WHEREAS, There is a need to continue and expand on the existing federally
- 2 funded U.S. Centers for Disease Control Breast and Cervical Cancer Screening
- 3 Program in this State due to the expiration of the mammography screening program
- 4 conducted by HSCRC; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The State of Maryland has conducted, for several years, a vigorous
- 6 public campaign urging women to get their yearly mammograms; and
- WHEREAS, The Maryland General Assembly believes women age 40 years and
- 8 over should not be denied the opportunity to get a mammogram because of their lack
- 9 of financial resources; now, therefore,

- 24 DEVICE, SCREENS, FILMS, AND CASSETTES, SPECIFICALLY FOR MAMMOGRAPHY
- 25 THAT DELIVERS AN AVERAGE RADIATION EXPOSURE OF LESS THAN ONE RAD
- 26 MID-BREAST WITH TWO VIEWS FOR EACH BREAST.
- 27 (5) "PROGRAM" MEANS THE BREAST CANCER SCREENING PROGRAM.
- 28 (B) (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH A BREAST CANCER
- 29 SCREENING PROGRAM.
- 30 (2) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO PROVIDE AN ANNUAL
- 31 SCREENING MAMMOGRAM AND CLINICAL BREAST EXAMINATION TO LOW-INCOME

- 4 (2) DOES NOT HAVE ACCESS TO HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE THAT
- 5 COVERS SCREENING MAMMOGRAMS AND CLINICAL BREAST EXAMINATIONS FOR
- 6 WOMEN AGED 40 YEARS AND OLDER.
- 7 (E) BEGINNING FISCAL YEAR 1999, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE AT
- 8 LEAST \$4,200,000 EACH YEAR FROM ITS GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATION TO FUND
- 9 THE PROGRAM TO EXPAND UPON THE EXISTING FEDERALLY-FUNDED CENTERS FOR
- 10 DISEASE CONTROL BREAST AND CERVICAL CANCER SCREENING PROGRAM.
- 11 (F) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO 12 IMPLEMENT THE PROGRAM.
- 13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 14 July 1, 1998.
