

Two professional counselors at large; 26 27 (ii) One shall be a certified professional counselor-marriage and 28 family therapist; 29 One shall be a certified professional counselor-alcohol and (iii) 30 drug; and 31 (iv) Two shall be consumer members. 32 The composition of the Board as to the race and sex of its members
