1 (II)AT OTHER TIMES AT THE CALL OF THE JOINT CHAIRMEN OF 2 THE TASK FORCE. THE TASK FORCE SHALL PUBLISH NOTICE OF EACH PUBLIC 4 MEETING ONCE EACH WEEK FOR 2 CONSECUTIVE WEEKS IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING 5 THE MEETING IN AT LEAST ONE NEWSPAPER OF GENERAL CIRCULATION IN THE 6 SANITARY DISTRICT AND IN AT LEAST ONE NEWSPAPER OF GENERAL CIRCULATION 7 IN PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY AND IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY. THE MEETING NOTICE 8 SHALL INCLUDE A SUMMARY OF THE PROPOSED AGENDA FOR THE MEETING. - 19 (H) (I) THE WSSC AND ALL OTHER STATE AND LOCAL AGENCIES SHALL
- 20 COOPERATE WITH AND PROVIDE ASSISTANCE AS NEEDED TO THE TASK FORCE.
- 21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 22 July 1, 1998. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years 18 months and, at the end
- 23 of June 30, 2000 December 31, 1999, with no further action required by the General
- 24 Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
