15 THE COMMISSION SHALL INCLUDE IN ITS ANNUAL REPORT TO THE16 LEGISLATIVE POLICY COMMITTEE OF THE MARYLAND GENERAL ASSEMBLY:

17 (1) THE EFFECT OF SATELLITE SIMULCAST BETTING ON THE RACING 18 INDUSTRY IN THE STATE;

19 (2) THE STATUS OF ALL PERMIT HOLDERS, TAKING INTO
 20 CONSIDERATION THE RESULTS OF INSPECTIONS REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION
 21 AND FINANCIAL INFORMATION THAT IS SUBMITTED TO THE COMMISSION;

22 (3) IF ANY ADDITIONAL PERMIT HAS BEEN GRANTED UNDER THIS 23 SECTION:

24 (I) THE REASONS FOR GRANTING THE PERMIT; AND

25 (II) THE ANTICIPATED IMPACT OF THE NEW FACILITY ON EXISTING 26 PERMIT HOLDERS AND RACING LICENSEES; AND

27 (4) IF AN APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT OR PERMIT RENEWAL HAS BEEN28 DENIED:

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(I) THE REASONS FOR DENYING THE PERMIT OR RENEWAL; AND

30(II)THE IMPACT ON RACING LICENSEES IF THE RACING31COMMISSION DENIED A PERMIT RENEWAL APPLICATION.
