## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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### **Election Law - Identification of Voters**

3 FOR the purpose of altering requirements of the Election Code relating to the

- 4 identification of voters at the polling place; requiring the State Board of
- 5 Elections to conduct a certain education program during the 1998 primary and
- 6 general elections; providing a delayed effective date for certain provisions of this
- 7 Act; and generally relating to polling place procedures.

# 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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## Article 33 - Election Code

19 (a) In accordance with instructions provided by the local board, an election 20 judge shall qualify a voter by:

21 (1) Locating the voter's name in the precinct register and locating the 22 preprinted voting authority card;

23 (2) (i) If the voter's name is not found on the precinct register, 24 searching the inactive list and if the name is found, qualifying the voter for voting as 25 instructed or

25 instructed; or

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	(ii) If the voter's name is not on the inactive list, contacting the ocal board office and, if authorized, issuing a temporary certificate of registration, as provided in § 3-601 of this article;
	(3) Establishing the identity of the voter by [requesting the voter to state the month and day of the voter's birth and comparing the response to the nformation listed in the precinct register;] REQUIRING THE VOTER TO:
7	(I) PRESENT TO THE ELECTION JUDGE:
8 9	1. A DRIVER'S LICENSE, IDENTIFICATION CARD ISSUED BY THE MOTOR VEHICLE ADMINISTRATION, OR VOTER IDENTIFICATION CARD; OR
12	2. IF THE VOTER CANNOT PROVIDE A FORM OF IDENTIFICAITON SPECIFIED IN ITEM 1 OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH, ANY OTHER FORM OF IDENTIFICATION THAT IS ISSUED BY A GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY AND THAT CONTAINS THE VOTER'S NAME, ADDRESS, AND DATE OF BIRTH; OR
	(II) IF THE VOTER DOES NOT HAVE ANY FORM OF IDENTIFICATION DESCRIBED IN ITEM (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, ASKING THE VOTER TO STATE HIS OR HER CURRENT ADDRESS AND DAY AND MONTH OF BIRTH;
17 18	(4) Verifying the address of the voter's residence AND THE VOTER'S DATE OF BIRTH;
	(5) If any changes to the voting authority card are indicated by a voter, making the appropriate changes in information on the card or other appropriate form; and
22 23	(6) Having the voter sign the voting authority card and either issuing the voter a ballot or sending the voter to a machine to vote.
26 27	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Administrative Board of Election Laws, in cooperation with the local election boards, shall conduct an education program during the 1998 primary and general elections to inform voters of the identification requirements that will be imposed in elections conducted after January 1, 1999.
29 30	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 1 of this Act shall take effect January 1, 1999.
31	SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall

32 take effect July 1, 1998.
