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#### **Medicaid - Emergency Service Transporters - Reimbursement**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to

4 reimburse certain public emergency service transporters for the costs of

5 transportation and medical services provided to a Medicaid Program recipient

6 during transport to certain facilities *in response to a 911 call* if the emergency

7 service transporter charges for its services and requests reimbursement from

8 the Program; *setting a limit on the amount of reimbursement from the Program;* 

9 requiring the Department to adopt certain regulations on or before a certain

10 date <u>negotiate the rate of reimbursement with certain public emergency service</u>

11 transporters for the costs of transportation and medical services provided to a

12 <u>Medicaid Program recipient</u> adopt certain regulations on or before a certain date;

13 defining a certain term; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally

14 relating to reimbursement for certain emergency service transporters under the

# 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.

19 (c) "Facility" means a hospital or nursing facility including an intermediate 20 care facility, skilled nursing facility, comprehensive care facility, or extended care 21 facility.

22 (h) "Program" means the Maryland Medical Assistance Program.

23 (i) "Program recipient" means an individual who receives benefits under the24 Program.

26 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "EMERGENCY SERVICE TRANSPORTER" MEANS A
27 PUBLIC ENTITY OR VOLUNTEER FIRE, RESCUE, OR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE
28 THAT PROVIDES EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.

(B) IF AN EMERGENCY SERVICE TRANSPORTER CHARGES FOR ITS SERVICES
AND REQUESTS REIMBURSEMENT FROM THE PROGRAM, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL
REIMBURSE THE EMERGENCY SERVICE TRANSPORTER, *IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$100 PER TRANSPORT*, FOR THE COST OF:

(1) TRANSPORTATION THE EMERGENCY SERVICE TRANSPORTER
 PROVIDES TO A PROGRAM RECIPIENT TO A FACILITY <u>IN RESPONSE TO A 911 CALL</u>;
 AND

4 (2) MEDICAL SERVICES THE EMERGENCY SERVICE TRANSPORTER
 5 PROVIDES TO THE PROGRAM RECIPIENT WHILE TRANSPORTING THE PROGRAM
 6 RECIPIENT TO A FACILITY *IN RESPONSE TO A 911 CALL*.

7 (C) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 1998, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT ANY 8 REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THIS SECTION.

9 (C) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL NEGOTIATE THE RATE OF REIMBURSEMENT

10 WITH AN EMERGENCY SERVICE TRANSPORTER IF THE EMERGENCY SERVICE

11 TRANSPORTER CHARGES FOR ITS SERVICES AND REQUESTS REIMBURSEMENT FROM

12 <u>THE PROGRAM FOR THE SERVICES PROVIDED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS</u>
 13 <u>SECTION.</u>

14(C)THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT ANY REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO15CARRY OUT THIS SECTION.

16 <u>SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED</u>, That, on or before January 1,

17 <u>1999</u>, the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene shall adopt any regulations

18 necessary to carry out § 15-114.1 of the Health - General Article as enacted under

19 Section 1 of this Act.

20 <u>SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall</u>
 21 <u>take effect October 1, 1998.</u>

22 SECTION 2. <u>4.</u> AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That<u>, except as provided in</u>

23 <u>Section 3 of this Act</u>, this Act shall take effect October 1, 1998 July 1, 1999.

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
