- 1 (2) LOCATIONS APPROVED FOR USE AS A LOADING ZONE SHALL BE 2 INTENDED EXCLUSIVELY FOR PASSENGERS RESIDING ON THE SAME SIDE OF THE 3 ROADWAY AS THE LOADING ZONE.
