A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Natural Resources - Snapping Turtles**

3 FOR the purpose of providing that the Department of Natural Resources may not
4 adopt a regulation that prohibits the catching of snapping turtles by a certain
5 method for certain purposes; providing certain limitations on the use of certain
6 methods of catching snapping turtles; and making stylistic changes.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article - Natural Resources**

15 4-738.

16 (a) [The] SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, THE Department
17 shall prescribe by [rules and regulations] REGULATION the methods to catch
18 snapping turtles.

19 (B) (1) THE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT PROHIBIT BY REGULATION THE
20 CATCHING OF SNAPPING TURTLES BY HOOK AND LINE AS A METHOD OF PREDATOR
21 CONTROL IN PONDS ON PRIVATE PROPERTY.

22 (2) A HOOK SET FOR PREDATOR CONTROL SHALL BE AT LEAST 1 INCH
23 BETWEEN BARB AND SHANK.

24 (3) A PERSON MAY NOT SET MORE THAN 30 HOOKS IN ANY DUCK
25 NESTING AREA.

1 [(b)] (C) A person may not catch or attempt to catch snapping turtles in the
2 tributary waters of Charles County from April 15 to May 31, inclusive. A person may
3 not use hook and line and trotline to catch snapping turtles in these waters.

4 [(c)] (D) The Department may not prohibit the use of turtle pots in areas
5 where nets are prohibited.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
7 October 1, 1998.
