- 3 FOR the purpose of reestablishing the Telecommuting Pilot Program; requiring the
- 4 Governor to establish a statewide Pilot Program; requiring the Secretary of
- 5 Budget and Management to adopt policies to administer the Pilot Program;
- 6 requiring the Secretary to report on the effect of the Pilot Program; requiring
- 7 the Department of Budget and Management to report concerning which State
- 8 agencies participate in the Pilot Program; defining certain terms; providing for
- 9 the termination of this Act; and generally relating to reestablishing a
- 10 Telecommuting Pilot Program.

- Section 2-801 through 2-803 to be under the new subtitle "Subtitle 8.

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 19 Article State Personnel and Pensions
- 20 SUBTITLE 8. TELECOMMUTING PILOT PROGRAM.
- 21 2-801.
- 22 (A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
- 23 INDICATED.
- 24 (B) "PILOT PROGRAM" MEANS THE TELECOMMUTING PILOT PROGRAM.
- 25 (C) "TELECOMMUTING" MEANS USING TELECOMMUNICATIONS TECHNOLOGY
- 26 TO WORK AT A LOCATION OTHER THAN A TRADITIONAL OFFICE SETTING.

- 2 (A) THE GOVERNOR SHALL REESTABLISH THE STATEWIDE TELECOMMUTING 3 PILOT PROGRAM.
- 4 (B) THE PURPOSE OF THE PILOT PROGRAM IS TO ALLOW STATE EMPLOYEES
- 5 TO WORK AT A LOCATION OTHER THAN A STATE OFFICE THROUGH THE USE OF
- 6 TELECOMMUNICATIONS TECHNOLOGY.
- 7 2-803.
- 8 THE SECRETARY SHALL:
- 9 (1) REINSTATE ANY GUIDELINES AND POLICIES PREVIOUSLY ADOPTED 10 FOR THE FORMER PILOT PROGRAM TO ESTABLISH AND CARRY OUT THE PURPOSES
- 11 OF THE PILOT PROGRAM:
- 12 (2) ADOPT ANY NECESSARY GUIDELINES AND POLICIES TO ESTABLISH 13 AND CARRY OUT THE PURPOSES OF THE PILOT PROGRAM;
- 13 THE CHART OUT THE FOR OBED OF THE FEOT TROOPING,
- 14 (3) ESTABLISH A STATE EMPLOYEE COMPUTER PURCHASING PROGRAM
- 15 TO ALLOW TELECOMMUTING STATE EMPLOYEES TO PURCHASE COMPUTERS AT
- 16 DISCOUNT PRICES OR THROUGH LOW-INTEREST LOANS PROVIDED BY THE STATE
- 17 EMPLOYEES CREDIT UNION; AND
- 18 (4) REQUIRE PARTICIPATING AGENCIES TO PROVIDE TELECOMMUTING
- 19 STATE EMPLOYEES WITH COPIES OF RELEVANT AGENCY TELEPHONE DIRECTORIES
- 20 AND REPORTS THAT ARE STORED ON COMPUTER DISK.
- 21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on or before October 1,
- 22 1999, the Secretary of Budget and Management shall submit a report to the Senate
- 23 Budget and Taxation Committee and the House Appropriations Committee, in
- 24 accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, concerning the effect of the
- 25 Pilot Program within each selected agency.
- 26 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of
- 27 Budget and Management, for the purposes of review and comment, shall notify the
- 28 Senate Budget and Taxation Committee and the House Appropriations Committee
- 29 upon the selection of the State agencies that will participate in this Pilot Program.
- 30 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 31 October 1, 1998. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of
- 32 September 30, 2001, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this
- 33 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
